<p>Short Description:</p> <p>The main purpose of this research is to investigate the associations between ethnic diversity, social capital, networking and economic performance. We will rely on quantitative empirical investigations based on survey data collected in Bosnia and Herzegovina, as well as on qualitative data gathered in SEE region (BiH, Croatia and Serbia). The project aims to get more insights on how ethnicity and ethnic diversity operates on the ground for different migrant groups in terms of heterogeneous and homogeneous ethnic environments, and intersects with other individual and socio-cultural characteristics, with particular focus on social capital.</p>	
<p>Main Objectives:</p> <p>Specifically, we aim to explore the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - How ethnic diversity of individual networking and diversity of neighbourhoods of individuals interact with their economic performance; and - How ethnic diversity of different migrant groups interacts with their socio-cultural and individual characteristics, including a special focus on social capital. 	
<p>Expected Outputs:</p> <p>A book published on English language with an international publishing house.</p> <p>Two papers based on empirical investigations will be submitted to world class journals for publication.</p> <p>Research briefs on English and local languages will be published electronically for domestic audiences.</p>
